# from state site committee

MILLSFIELD — It took a year but Granite Reliable Power has received its certificate of site and facility to construct 33 wind turbines along a 6.5 mile ridge line in the Phillips Brook watershed.

The state Energy Facilities Site Evaluation Committee Wednesday issued the certificate along with a detailed list of conditions GRP must meet.

The committee had voted on June 10 to issue the certificate but allowed its legal counsel 20 days to produce the written order. The deadline was later extended to July 15. The final order is 134 pages

# Funding secured for Hodes' Northern **Borders Regional Commission**

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Congressman Paul Hodes announced that \$3 million in funding for the Northern Borders Regional Commission has been secured for use in 2010.

Wednesday afternoon, Hodes' office issued a press release announcing that \$3 million has been attached to the 2010 Energy and Water Resources Appropriation Act. The bill is on its way through the House of Representatives, and Hodes said, in the press release, he is confident it will pass through the Senate was well.

# in fair condition

SUCCESS - Rescuers from Maine and New Hampshire transported an injured hiker by litter 2.5 miles down the rugged Mahoosuc Trail Wednesday night. The hiker, William Tarkulich, 53, of Rexington, Mass., had slipped and hit his head on a rock earlier that afternoon. He was admitted to Androscoggin Valley Hospital in Berlin where he was listed in fair condition yesterday.

A press release issued by New Hampshire law enforcement said Berlin dispatch received at call reporting the accident at approximately 2:45 p.m. from a friend hiking with Tarkulich. Berlin dispatch notified N.H. Fish and Game which determined Tarkulich was on the Mahoosuc Trail in Riley Township, Maine. N.H. Fish and Game contacted their Maine counterparts but the parties thought the New Hampshire officers would be able to respond factor

According to an article in the Lewiston Sun Journal newspaper, two Appalachian Trail through-hikers helped get Tarkulich back through Mahoosuc Notch. They headed to where the Notch Road intersects the Appalachian Trail. About 30 rescuers from Maine and New

Hampshire carried Tarkulich by litter down to the Notch Trailhead on the Success Pond Road. The rescue team reached the trailhead about see HIKER page 7

and gear. of top-closes Storios encounters with the aliencephalopods chased many veteran divers out of the water and created a whirlwind of excitement among the rest, who are torn between their personal safety and the once-in-alifetime chance to swim with

the deep-sea giants. The so-called Humboldt squid are native to the deep waters off Mexico where they have been known to attack humans and are nicknamed "red devils" for their rust-red coloring and mean streak. Those who dive with them there chum the water with bait and sometimes get in a metal cage or wear chain mail to avoid being lashed by tentacles

# **Budget umpire: Health** care bills would raise costs

WASHINGTON (AP) — Democrats' health care bills won't meet President Barack Obama's goal of slowing the ruinous rise of medical costs, Congress' budget umpire warned on Thursday, giving weight to critics who say the legislation could break the bank.

The sobering assessment from Congressional Budget Office Director Douglas Elmendorf came as House Democrats pushed to pass a partisan bill through committees, while in the Senate a small group of lawmakers continued to seek a deal that could win support from both political parties. With the pressure mounting on all sides, Senate

Majority Leader Harry Reid, D-Ney, dismissed as "a waste of money" a television ad campaign by Obama's political organization aiming to nudge moderates of both parties off the fence. He called it "Democrats running ads against Democrats." A spokesman later said Reid has no problem with the effort

# China's economy accelerates with help of stimulus plans growth should easily reach the

BELJING (AP) — China has bought a rebound in economic growth with a flood of government spending and bank loans, averting a surge in politically dangerous unemployment and fueling hopes that it might help lead a world recovery. The government's announce-

ment Thursday that second-

quarter growth accelerated by 7.9 percent from a year earlier boosted global financial markets, though Beijing cautioned that a full-fledged recovery is not firmly established. The economy grew by 6.1 percent in the first quarter, according to the National Bureau of Statistics, and analysts said full-year

government's 8 percent target. The increase highlighted the

economy's dependence on Beijing's \$586 billion (4 trillion yuan) stimulus effort. It was launched after demand for Chinese exports collapsed, wiping out tens of millions of factory jobs and raising the specter of unrest.

# N.H. teen found dead in Wells, Maine motel

Police said 21-year-old Dino Trent of Haverhill, Mass., who registered the room, was charged with allowing a minor to possess or consume liquor on premises under his control resulting in death. Trent was taken to the York County Jail in lieu of \$5,000 cash

Another person sharing the room, 19-year-old David McNee of Wilmington, Mass., was charged with attempting to shoplift liquor from a supermarket.

# N.H. fire officials warn of dangerous rivers

FRANKLIN (AP) - Fire officials in New Hampshire's Lakes Region are asking people to use extreme caution on rivers that are running at all-time highs after a very rain spring.

The fire chiefs in Franklin and Tilton say anyone who goes into the Winnipesaukee River for any reason should wear a life preserver. And even that won't keep people from being tossed against the rocks if they get thrown from an inner tube.

Ken Norton, an experienced kayaker, told the Citizen that he won't even try to paddle the lower part of the river when the water is this fast. A typical speed for mid-July is about 300 feet per second, but last week it was 2,000 feet per second.

the northern regions of Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont and New York, Hodes began work on the commission when he took office in 2007 and said the program would have a significant impact on this region.

The North Country is struggling in this difficult economy, with thousands of families worried about their jobs. and with many forced to leave their community to find work," said Hodes. in the press release. "This funding will begin a federal-state partnership to bring needed infrastructure and new jobs to the North Country, While this funding is a good start, I will continue to work to bring more federal resources to create new good paying

jobs in the North Country. It will be able to provide federal investment to bring improvement in roads, rail, broadband, job training, energy generation and health care in Grafton, Coos, Sullivan and Carroll counties in New Hampshire. Coos County has the highest unemployment in the state at 8.8 percent, said the press release.

The Northern Border Regional Com-

mission was included in the Farm Bill, which was passed in 2008, and authorized to spend \$30 million annually for projects. When the program was authorized no funds were allotted to the program.

Since the program was authorized, Hodes has been searching for a way to fund the program.


"Finding the right funding source is always the challenge," said Hodes, during a previous visit to Berlin.

While the search for the remaining \$27 million for the commission continues, Hodes wrote a letter to President Barack Obama asking him to appoint a federal co-chair of the commission.

Hodes is looking to have the commission ready to start when the \$3 million is available at the beginning of the next fiscal year.

"In order to the commission to invest in the belt of counties along the northern border from Maine through New York, a federal co-chair must be appointed," said Hodes, in the letter.

In the letter, Hodes said that appointing a chair would be a final step in putting the commission to work.

# **An Hour With Reptiles**

Katv reached behind a table in the big white tent that had been erected on the grounds of the Errol School. When her hands came back into view they held a small turtle, whose protruding round legs were searching out something substantial on which to stand. All they found was air. But Katy held it firmly in her grip. Whether it knew it or not, the turtle was in no danger of falling. This particular turtle was in no danger at all. In fact, as was later learned, turtles are among the longest lived creatures on earth. This one was just the first of four small-sized reptiles Katy would hold in her hands last Saturday afternoon.

This month and next, the Lake Umbagog National Wildlife Refuge is working in cooperation with other regional agencies to present a series of programs designed to encourage one and all to engage or re-engage with the wonders of Nature. Saturday's program on reptiles, called "Scales and Tales" was the first of six such "Connect with Nature" programs to be held in July and August.

The program in Errol, attended by a small but very interested group of people, was being presented by the Chewonki Traveling Natural History Program. The traveling natural history program is one of several outreach programs offered by the Chewonki Foundation of Wiscasset, Maine, which is dedicated to "fostering an appreciation for the natural world and for working in community with others." Katy, as she introduced herself, was the day's presenter.

Reptiles, we learned, are divided into four groups: crocodilians, snakes, turtles, and lizards. Katy would tell us about and show us live

examples of all four. She began by asking if anyone knew what distinguished reptiles from other kinds of wild-

She quickly found that some in the audience had clearly done some homework. "They're coldblooded," said one. "They have scaly skin," said another. Clearly impressed, Katy elaborated on the answers, explaining each in detail.

Next to find itself squirming in Katy's hands was a corn snake. Largely found in the south eastern and central states of the United States, the corn snake, a constrictor, gets its name from what some see as maize-like markings on its belly. Another explanation is that early farmers would find the non-venomous snakes in their cornfields and corn cribs, and first thought that the snakes were eating their corn. But the snakes were actually helping the farmers by eating rats and mice.

Many of us, of course, are repulsed, even frightened by the sight of snakes. We think of them as slimy and dangerous, when, in reality, only about ten percent of snakes are venomous, and some, such as the garter snake, can be of great help in our gardens.

Next came a Bearded Dragon, a member of the lizard family, and a native of Australia. Like snakes, Bearded Dragons shed their skin, although, unlike snakes, which usually shed their skins whole, the dragon sheds its skin in pieces. Like the corn snake, it does well in captivity, and is

popular with those who like to keep exotic creatures pets. Its diet consists insects, mice, and certain fruits vegetables, a diet somewhat similar to that of turtles, although the Bearded Dragon

more carnivorous.

Last to find its way into Katy's hands was an American alligator, still small enough to be

Many in Saturday's enthusiastic group knew the significant visual difference between an

alligator and a crocodile. The alligator's snout is rounded, shaped like the letter U. The crocodile has a more V-shaped snout, somewhat like a triangle. The alligator's skin is also a darker green in color than the crocodile's. During the hour-long presentation, we were

also shown encased examples of a snake's bone structure and shed skin. Panels of informative

The order includes as a condition compliance with the High Elevation Mitigation Settlement Agreement GRP reached with N.H. Fish and Game and the Appalachian Mountain Club. Under that agreement, GRP would protect 1,735 acres of high elevation land and transfer ownership to Fish and Game. It would give the state \$750,000 to conserve other land outside the project area with a focus on high elevation spruce fir habitat in Coos County used by the American marten. Another \$200,000 would go to Fish and Game to study species of concern.

In addition, the subcommittee is requiring additional pre-construction and post construction breeding bird and raptor surveys as well as a postconstruction bird and bat mortality study. GRP is barred from any major land clearing on Mt. Kelsey or Dixville Peak between April 1 and Aug. 1 when birds are nesting.

Also incorporated as conditions are

the decommissioning agreement GPR reached with the Coos County Commission and its agreement with the town of Dummer over lighting at the switching yard and continued public access to the snowmobile/ATV on Dummer Pond Road.

Granite Reliable Power must comply with all state permits and certificates including wetlands and alteration of terrain permits and water quality certificates

Other conditions included in the final order are:

\* GPR can not begin construction until all the financing for the construction phase is completely in place. Construction of the 99-megawatt wind farm is estimated at about \$275 mil-

\* All areas above 2,700 feet in elevation must be revegetated according to a plan to be developed by GRP and Fish and Game

\* GRP must prepare and implement a detailed safety and access plan with Coos County before the start of construction

\* GPR must use its best efforts to maintain the integrity of the Coos Trail. The wind farm will require the

relocation of a portion of the trail. All turbines must not be climbable from the ground to 20 feet above ground level.

\* The certificate is not transferable to any other person or entity without the prior written approval of the EFSEC.

The certificate is issued to GRP based on its current ownership structure with 75 percent of the company owned by Noble Environmental Power and 25 percent by Freshet Wind Energy. The committee must give prior written approval to any asset sale.

While the list of conditions is extensive, the commission rejected approximately 30 conditions requested by Senior Assistant Attorney General Peter Roth, who represented the public in the EFSEC proceedings, Roth had urged that GRP be required to construct a fire station near the intersection of Dummer Pond Road and Routes 110 or 16 and equip it with two forest fire trucks. He also wanted GRP to construct a visitors center in Errol, install three informational kiosks along Routes 16 and 26, do guided interpre tive tours of the project, and provide \$200,000 to the state Department of Resources and Economic Development to promote eco-tourism in the project area.

Roth recommended GRP required to hire a general contractor for the construction and have an engineer who specializes in high elevation projects review the project plans. He proposed that before construction gets underway, GRP put together a technical advisory committee made up of local officials, representatives of conservation groups, regulatory agencies and GRP to conduct bird studies and designate up to \$300,000 to fund its work

None of those recommendations made their way into the final order. Granite Reliable Power still needs

approval from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Federal Aviation Administration before it can go ahead with the project.

very own race car Andrew is a 16 year old senior at Berlin High School, and it has been his life-long ambition to finally reach this point

"My dad and I did a lot of go-karting when I was younger," said Andrew, "We were part of the Cumberland Motor Club and took part in events that took place in parking lots at such venues as the Augusta Civic Center and Storyland. There, the racing organizers would set up road courses using cones and barriers and we raced in timed events.'

That took care of Andrew's passion in the early vears, however, Andrew didn't realize what he was actually headed for.

The first time that we saw a Rally event, I knew that was exactly what I wanted to do," said Paine. "We went to all of the Rally events that we could and took in all of the information that we could get."

As a matter of fact, Paine became acquainted with Whitefield's Tim O'Neil of the O'Neil Rally School. Paine sold all of his go-karting equipment and in May of 2008 at the ripe age of 15, Paine invested \$4,000 and took part in the four-day O'Neil driving school. Needless to say after the school and the experience. Paine was convinced that he was ready to become more involved as a competitor in the Rally events

Enter new friend Eric Corcoran. Corcoran is a 20 vear old that graduated from Gorham High School and is currently attending college at U-Maine of Farmington, Eric and his father began attending some local Rally races and were present at the winter Rally that was being held in Dalton, last winter. Paine's father, John, thought that he had

recognized the Corcorans at the event, and was currently working with the Eric's mom at the time. At work. John took the bold step and approached Eric's mom and asked if it was her son at the Winter Rally. Eric's mom told John that Eric was extremely interested in being involved in Rally racing, whether it be in the passenger seat or as a driver. That was all that Paine needed to hear and he contacted Eric to be a possible navigator for Andrew and the rest is history. The two got together and have been working towards their goal ever since.

The final step in the process of participating in the Rally was of course the purchasing of a car. Andrew's contacts through the O'Neil driving school, landed him his first ride. An instructor at the O'Neil Rally school, Al Moody, sold Paine a 1995 Dodge Neon. that was all built and had only been used as a Rally car. The vehicle had just 27,000 miles on it, all be it some very tough 27,000 miles.

With a car in place, the dynamic duo needed to begin to work together. The more established teams rely on an in-car radio system, unfortunately for now. Eric has to shout out instructions for his driver.

"It will have to do for now," said Corcoran, "The radio system will come down the road."

Practice? Where can we go for Practice? Barry Kelley of White Mountain Lumber, graciously stepped forward and brought the newly formed racers to an old woods road, and allowed them to hegin their working together

"Our first practice was an experience in itself," said Paine. "Thankfully Eric's grandfather was near by. While practicing we broke the transmission and the car wouldn't move. Eric's grandfather got us back to




